The National Literacy Trust carried out an independent evaluation of the impact of using First News Education resources in school. The research, conducted in 2015 with over 500 children in Key Stage 2 before and after using First News Education resources, showed positive changes in both students' reading attitudes and attainment.

### Significant improvement in reading skills

- Participating children made significantly more reading progress than expected during the eight-week period (measured using the New Group Reading Test)
- There were particular improvements in pupils' reading comprehension skills
- Young people developed more confidence in their own reading abilities

#### Increased motivation to read more widely

- There were significant increases in the number of pupils reading other materials in their free time including both fiction books and non-fiction books
- Children became more likely to read newspapers in their free time
- Three quarters of children thought newspapers are interesting and more than half thought they were fun, after the eight-week period


